Given that judges, counsel and witnesses need not be in the same location, the pos

This type of "virtual" witness videoconferencing is beginning to be used in courts across the country. The witness and court reporter are connected to the "court" using ISDN or other broadband connection lines. With the cost barriers rapidly diminishing, the use of video conferencing for client contact, depositions, witness testimony and many other uses will increase greatly.
